The Liudahl Fine Arts and Service Scholarship is designed to provide financial assistance for Kindred High School seniors working toward an advanced degree.

This scholarship was created by Norman and Agnes Liudahl. Norman and Agnes married February 12, 1971. Once married, they made their home on the farm Norman took over from his father until 1996, when they moved to West Fargo.

Agnes served as the first secretary of the West Fargo school system (they even dedicated the yearbook to her in 1963!). She has always had an interest in education and the welfare of students. Agnes loves to serve others and has volunteered her time as: a greeter at Redhawks games; chaperone of organizations like Luther League; Sunday school superintendent; wedding coordinator at her church; president of the Auxiliary; and volunteer at Bethany Homes.

Norman was also very dedicated to his community. He was active in the Kindred Lions club for many years holding various offices. Norman helped students achieve their goals by serving as a Scout Master for the Davenport Troop and worked with youth through his church.

The Liudahls were members of the Concordia C400 club and enjoyed supporting and attending plays, concerts and sporting events in the community.
